Suitcases of any size and type Anything on wheels/ castors - which the children can move Plastic milk crates Road signs and cones Kitchen pots, pans, baking trays, work tables, wooden spoons, chopping boards Tools like spades, trowels and brooms Tubes of various sizes and various materials Buckets Nets and ropes

Fabric (large sheets/ brightly coloured fabric) Foam sheets / body boards Wooden pallets Metal frames Cable drums Guttering Noodles (the type you use in the swimming pool!) Pegs (to help to set up dens)
